



FENWAY PARK

Home to the 2004 and 2007 World Series Champions, Boston's beloved Red Sox, Fenway is the oldest, and most historic, of all operating Major League Baseball stadiums.

Opened in 1912, Fenway celebrated its 95th birthday this year and has seen the likes of Babe Ruth, Ted Williams and Carl Yastrzemski, three of baseball's greatest players of all-time, play on its field. Fenway is home to the legendary "Green Monster" wall in left field, "Pesky's Pole," the right field foul line pole named for Sox legend Johnny Pesky's home runs hit around the pole, and the red seat in the right field bleachers (Section 42, Row 37, Seat 21) that signifies the spot where "Teddy Ballgame" Williams hit the longest measurable home run in Fenway Park at 502 feet.
